Cat Stats


Rescues/Surrenders – Through the first half of the year, we have taken in 137 cats and kittens-- 11% more than last year. Of that number, only 2 were returned kindred kitties, 15 were transferred from other rescues, 60 were surrendered pets, 54 were unowned cats, and 6 were born to a rescued pregnant mom.

<u>Adoptions</u> – We've rehomed 98 cats this year through June: 29 adults, 21 teens and 48 kittens which is 18% more than 2021—yay!! The number of cats we are able to rehome is directly correlated to the number of cats/kittens we are able to foster throughout the year.

Spay/Neuter — Through June, we've spayed/neutered 134 cats—85 of them were Kindred Kitties. Of this total 23.3% were neighborhood kitties that we were able to have fixed through a TNR (Trap-Neuter-Release) Program and the remainder were owned cats that were altered with our help. And, as in the past, when we were unable to directly assist, we successfully referred individuals to other alternative programs to ensure that we maximized the spay/neuter of as many cats as possible in support of our mission.

Fostering - At the end of June, we were caring for 74 cats and kittens. Please spread the word that Kindred Kitties contin-
