Meet Coral!!

At the end of February, Mama Calypso and her four kittens—just a week old—were surrendered to us. After a few days, their foster mom noticed that one of the kittens was "flat chested" which made it difficult for her to nurse and she wasn't



gaining weight at nearly the weight that her siblings were. A trip to the vet confirmed that her problem was one that definitely needed to be dealt with.



Coral was diagnosed with a condition referred to as *Pectus evcavatum* or "Funnel Chest" which is a congenital condition causing the sternum and rib cage to be misshapen and sunken into the chest. It can lead to serious issues if there is not enough space for the heart and lungs to grow. Surgery to correct this condition is most effec-

tive and successful while the kitten's bones are still pliable and involves shaping the ribs and expanding the chest.

Thanks to Dr. David Brdecka at VSC Surgery Department in Bannockburn IL, Coral is on her way to a normal life! She was initially fitted with her first chest plate, which was replaced by a second one as she grew. Throughout the whole process, she had to be kept quiet and isolated—not natural for a kitten! She's been so

good about that. Once that second plate is removed, and after a short recovery, she will be able to do all the things a normal kitten does! And we'll be able to get her ready for her forever home!!


Rescues/Surrenders – We took in 123 cats and kittens. Of that number, 72 were surrendered pets, 31 were unowned cats, 6 were transferred from other shelters, and 14 were born to rescued pregnant cats. This number was a 43% increase over what we took in during the same period last year.

Adoptions – We re-homed 63 kitties (18 adults, 28 teens and 17 kittens).

Spay/Neuter – We facilitated the spay/ neuter of a total of 99 cats. This year, we are able, with funds provided by generous donors, and thru a grant provided by the John & Ruth Kloss Foundation to continue to assist individuals in getting cats fixed. So far this year, we have facilitated the spay/neuter of 58 owned and neighborhood cats. And, as in the past, where we were unable to help in some areas, we were successful in referring individuals to alternative programs to ensure that we maximized spay/neuter in general.

Foster Care – We are currently housing 96 cats, and are grateful for the great team of foster families who make themselves available to house our kindred kitties. There are times when we receive as many as 15-30 calls in a week from one place or another, and based on our available space, we just can't help them all. Because of the increased number of cats we

have taken in this year already, our need for fosters is even greater. If you have ever considered fostering, now would be a great time to start! 
Sometimes Special Needs Arise!

We are finished out the month of April taking in a record number of 78 cats and kittens — 44 in the last week (17 adults and 27 kittens). So to say our volunteers and fosters were busy is an understatement.

Thirty nine of the kitties have come from one home who asked for our help to reduce the number of cats both in and around their home. What probably started as a couple neighborhood strays spiraled quickly out of control. Cats can reproduce so fast!! This is why spay/neuter and TNR are so important. We are thankful they asked for our assistance and that we have been able to help with this big task! The kitties are settling into their foster homes and while they are very scared, they are also quite approachable and sweet. We look forward to getting to know them as they decompress and helping them find their forever homes. You will be hearing more about them in the near future!!

As we always say, if you ever considered fostering, there is always a need! But we also have a need for individuals who are available at times to help transport kitties from foster to and from spay/neuter appointments (in Milwaukee) when our fosters are not available to do so.





An unspayed female cat, her mate, and their offspring producing an average of 2.8 surviving kittens per litter at a rate of two litters a year adds up quickly.

- 1 year: 12 cats
- 2 years: 67 cats
- 3 years: 376 cats
- 4 years: 2107 cats
- 5 years: 11801 cats
- 6 years: 66,088 cats
- 7 years: 370,092 cats
- 8 years: 2,072,514 cats
- 9 years, 11,606,077 cats

Spaying or neutering one cat saves many lives.






We are now moving into the planning and investigative phase to search out what our best options will be for the new Adoption Center, and to even check out a few buildings.
